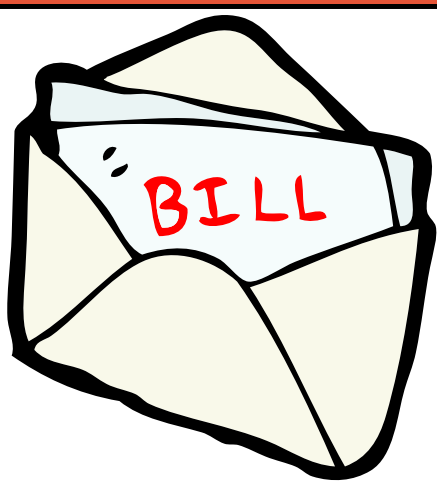


PLAN YOUR BUDGET
